

Mission Aviation Fellowship Announces Relocation to Idaho

For all of its 60-year history, the headquarters of Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) called Southern California “home.” However, the rising cost of living and of conducting business there recently led the international ministry to conduct an extensive relocation study.

After carefully reviewing and evaluating the six-month study conducted by the MAF relocation task force, the MAF Board of Directors announced today its unanimous decision to relocate the organization’s headquarters to the Boise, Idaho area. The move is targeted to take place in the July-August 2005 timeframe.

The confirmation of the relocation decision was announced to the Redlands staff earlier today during the ministry’s weekly chapel and via e-mail to the staff overseas. MAF President, Kevin Swanson, affirmed the Lord’s hand in this process, “The ministry of MAF stands to be significantly enhanced by positioning our headquarters and home staff in a more economical location. This move will reduce headquarters overhead significantly and will provide added opportunities to expand the ministry in the places that God has called us to serve.”

It is significant that this decision was announced in a chapel service dedicated to a group of new missionaries to be commissioned next week for service overseas. The majority of the staff at the MAF

headquarters has indicated that they will relocate with the organization. A relocation director and committee will be appointed soon to facilitate the move. Some major benefactors to the ministry have expressed an interest in providing financial assistance. A capital campaign will be initiated within the next two weeks.

The President concluded his speech by saying: “may God bless the people of this great state, may God bless our troops, and may God bless the USA.”



In his first visit to Idaho as President of the United States, George W. Bush addressed 10,000 Idahoans in Nampa on Wednesday, August 24th. Upon entering the Idaho Center, the President was greeted with thunderous applause and a standing ovation from all of those in attendance.

After the applause subsided, the President introduced the First Lady, the Governor, Idaho’s Congressional Delegation, and Idaho’s Armed Servicemen and National Guardsmen – to which the crowd quickly reacted with another standing ovation. Following the ovation, the President boldly affirmed that “patriotism is alive and well in Idaho, and in the rest of the USA.”

The President’s intentions were clear: he was here to honor

I was born in the hills of Kentucky in 1920. Both my parents and grandparents were Christians and from my earliest years I was exposed to the Word of GOD. I received the LORD at an early age.

In 1940 I married a Christian girl and we have enjoyed 65 years together. We have been blessed with four children, fifteen grandchildren and twenty great grandchildren.

I went into military service for our country in 1942 and served three years until the war ended. After World War II, I began gospel work with a small church in Longview, Washington. During the fifties, I served in youth work and began pastoral work in the sixties.

In 1969 I was asked to begin a circuit ministry, traveling among sixteen small assemblies of churches from Arizona to Canada. This continued for twenty years. In 1990 I was asked to come to Boise to help in the Collister Community Church, after the pastor died.

One of the problems I encountered in a number of churches during my circuit ministry was legalism – rules that go beyond the intended purpose of scripture and becomes the doctrine of men, described in Colossians 2:20-23: "...touch not, taste not, handle not." Rules in many areas such as music, dress, jewelry and a myriad of other regulations of men.

Doctrine comes from three sources: doctrine or teaching of GOD, doctrine of men and doctrine of devils. The Pharisees in the life of JESUS are prime examples of the error of making the doctrine of men as they carried GOD's standard beyond what was intended, even accusing our SAVIOR of violations.

Legalism can discourage people and drive them from GOD's Word, so may we rightly divide the Word and apply it in the keeping of The HOLY SPIRIT's intent.

I consider it a great honor and privilege to be allowed of the LORD to continue in His work, even at my 85 years of age. We are presently building a larger church sanctuary, having outgrown our old building.

The Battle for Men's Souls

As Christian men, we are engaged in a battle for men's souls – a battle many men have been increasingly aware of since 9-11-2001. They lost their souls by exchanging the truth of God for a lie. The lie comes in many forms but at its core is unbelief that says, "Jesus Christ alone is not enough to make you happy. You need something else."

Undoubtedly, you are surrounded by these men and may even be one of them yourself. We are in a life and death battle for their souls and there can be no greater cause for Christian men than to be involved in a campaign to engage every man in America with a credible offer of Christ. Someone has said, "I would rather fail in a cause that will ultimately succeed than succeed in a cause that would ultimately fail." This is a cause that we must win.

THE NEED

A woman went to work after college with Pat Morley's Man in the Mirror ministry. She wanted to work in a ministry to men. Why? She said, "When I was nine my mother and father separated. Over the next several years I saw my father a few times. Then, when I was thirteen, they divorced. After that I never saw my father again."

There are 98,000,000 men in America 18 years of age and older.

Evangelism: Regrettably, 63 million men make no profession of Christ.

Discipleship: Amazingly, 90 million men are not involved in any kind of discipleship. Only 6 million men are involved in discipleship – only 1 out of every 15 men. Can you imagine fielding a football team on which only "one" man knows how to play the game?

Up to 70% of men seek out pornography. Adultery is out of control.

As many Christians will divorce as non-Christians (34%, Barna Research Group).

4 out of 5 students in evangelical churches will drop out of church by their senior year in high school (Howard Hendricks).

Men are addicted to everything from money to secret thought lives to the comfortable secluded environments they work so hard to create.

Most men will give the best years of their lives to ideas that never had any possibility of making them happy.

Most men have "success sickness" – the disease of

always wanting more, and never being happy when they get it.

Most men only know enough about God to be disappointed in Him.

They are tired, restless, confused, lonely, and empty. Is it any wonder why America is mired in the moral decay of divorce, adultery, pornography, abortion, and a hundred other problems?

The family is disintegrating. We've become a nation of spiritual widows and practical orphans. Who will turn the hearts of fathers toward their children? Who will teach men to love and honor their wives? Who will awaken men to see that comfort is not abundance—that bigger barns are not what we need in times like these? Who will call men to a radical surrender to Christ?

THE OPPORTUNITY

It is sad to see that the church has not been able to muster the ongoing will or comprehensive strategy to disciple men. Discipling men is not a top priority in any denomination based upon their actual allocations of financial and intellectual resources.

Yet discipling men is our greatest strategic ministry opportunity. It is an under-managed area that can offer a greater return on labor and capital allocated to this priority.

The church desperately needs what disciplined men have to offer. Men who love and follow Jesus become leaders, don't divorce their wives, and don't neglect their children. They donate more money, volunteer for more service, make a bigger kingdom impact in the community, and they invite more visitors to the church. In short, reaching men is a battle plan for success.

THE CHALLENGE

Why should we become involved?

Jesus charged us to be the church militant, but too often we're asking the church staff to plan our next bake sale. The army of God is being led by the Pillsbury Dough Boy. It's time to move from a peace-time agenda to a war-time agenda. Will we lose some friends? Maybe, but do we really need to keep people on board who say "Peace, peace" while every day we hear heart-breaking stories of new casualties in this battle for men's souls?

This is a war we can win. Let us not worry about losing those whose highest ambition is to live in a gated community while the rest of the nation is going to hell. Let us be like Churchill. Let us sound a clarion call to war. Let us sound a call to revolution. Let's raise an army that will march into battle and plant the flag of Jesus Christ in men's souls.

The Ten Commandments Update

There is good news for us in this confusing Supreme Court ruling on Ten Commandments displays. *The Court ruled that a stand-alone Ten Commandments monument, identical to the one that was on display here in Boise in Julia Davis Park for 39 years, is permissible.*

In the Texas case, the monument stood just 75 feet from a government building, while our monument site is a long ways from any seat of government power.

In the Texas case, the Court cited the presence of other markers and monuments on statehouse grounds. In Julia Davis Park, where our monument was and where our proposed display will go, you can find the Anne Frank Memorial, a memorial to World War II veterans, a statue of Julia Davis, a statue of Sacagawea (dedicated several years ago, by the way, with a Native American religious ceremony), a black history museum, and historic cabins.

The similarities between our situation and the Texas case are striking enough that our proposed display can be easily recognized as permissible according to the Supreme Court.

MAYOR APPARENTLY UNWILLING TO WORK WITH US

We will seek a meeting with the Mayor to invite him to work with us, using the Texas decision, to return a constitutionally protected monument to the park. He has so far indicated, according to media accounts, an unwillingness to collaborate with us. If he chooses not to come together with us, we will focus our efforts on getting our initiative on the ballot. This initiative, for which we gathered 19,000 signatures last summer, would create a Ten Commandments display virtually identical to one in Pocatello which has already been declared constitutional by a federal judge. This display would be erected on the original site of our Ten Commandments monument.

The great news on this front, as I mentioned yesterday, is that we just found out that our state supreme court has

accepted our case, and oral arguments will be heard in late August or early September. We are optimistic that the state supreme court, which historically has firmly protected the right to vote, will rule in our favor and order the city to hold an election on our initiative. The best case scenario would be for our initiative to be on the ballot this coming November, at the same time two council members who voted to remove the monument (Jerome Mapp and Maryann Jordan) will be standing for re-election.

Polls have consistently indicated that at least 75% of the American public support the public posting of the Ten Commandments. If we can get our initiative before the voters, we are confident that we will prevail.

THE BAD NEWS

The unfortunate news is the Supreme Court decisions from yesterday are hopelessly confusing when taken together. They provide virtually no guidance for the resolution of future controversies over the public display of the Ten Commandments, and simply guarantee that this issue will continue to fester.

As Justice Scalia noted yesterday, what we are dealing with here is a "dictatorship of a shifting Supreme Court majority" which is making decisions without any "consistently applied principle."

THE CONSTITUTIONAL BOTTOM LINE

The essential truth is this. The Establishment clause in the First Amendment was designed by the Founders for one purpose only: to prevent Congress from choosing one Christian denomination and making it the official church of the United States. The Establishment clause does not restrain Congress – or any other political entity – in any other way.

Since the Ten Commandments are embraced by every Christian denomination, as well as by Judaism, and honored even in the Muslim faith, a Ten Commandments monument cannot possibly violate the Establishment clause.

As Justice Thomas pointed out, "establishment" is only "establishment" if it involves some kind of coercion, some

form of "established" religion (the Congregational church in some New England states, the Anglican church in Virginia, etc). All nine of these states eventually "disestablished" their state churches by 1833, which was certainly the path of wisdom. The point is that our Constitution treats religious expression as issues for states and communities to decide, not Congress and certainly not the Supreme Court.

As Justice Thomas correctly pointed out yesterday, what Texas does in Texas and what Boise does in Boise with Ten Commandments monuments is properly none of the Supreme Court's business.

Because our judiciary is currently out of control, and shows little if any regard for constitutional restraints on its authority, every one of us has a stake in nominations for the federal court system, especially the Supreme Court. We must insist on judges who will respect the original intent of the Constitution, allow themselves to be bound by its restraints, and refuse to impose their own social agenda on the rest of us.

APPEAL DENIED

Judge Duff McKee today denied our friends' appeal of their conviction for peacefully protesting the removal of the Ten Commandments monument from Julia Davis Park. Our friends had argued that the city's actions in removing the monument were illegal since the city did not follow its own municipal code in their actions. Municipal code requires the city, when it disposes of valuable "surplus" property, to put the property up for bid. This is the process the city has followed to the letter in seeking to dispose of Community House, but completely ignored in the case of the monument.

However, Judge McKee ruled in favor of the city, essentially saying that whether the city's actions were legal or not was irrelevant to our friends' defense. Our friends will take some time to decide whether they'll pursue a further appeal.

"DUCKING, BOBBING AND WEAVING"

Judge McKee did acknowledge, in passing, the lack of spine on the city's part by saying that, in removing the monument to avoid a possible lawsuit, the city was "ducking, bobbing, and weaving" in trying to evade the empty threat of Fred Phelps, the gay-hating preacher from Topeka, Kansas. Such actions provide a sad contrast to the courage and forthrightness of Mayor Tom Dale of Nampa and Mayor Garrett Nancolas of Caldwell, both of whom told Mr. Phelps to take a hike and haven't heard from him since. And both cities still have their Ten Commandments monuments in place, right where they have been for decades.





Activist Judges

Thomas Jefferson once said, "The Constitution... is a mere thing of wax in the hands of the judiciary which they may twist and shape into any form they please."

I believe that the future of our federal courts is one of the most important political issues facing Christian citizens today. The fact is, the courts are the first line of attack on traditional values used by liberal activists. And in many cases, activist judges are leading the way.

As I travel around the state on the campaign trail, meeting and listening to Idahoans, the issue of activist judges continues to be brought to my attention.

There's no question that some judges are overstepping their bounds by legislating from the bench. Recently, we've seen judges around the country redefine the institution of marriage, overturning initiatives approved by overwhelming majorities.

Courts have attempted to eliminate the phrase "under God" from the Pledge of Allegiance, ban public prayer, and remove long-standing displays of the Ten Commandments from public property.

These are all important issues that should not be decided in court by a judge. Yet, there seems to be no end in sight to these abuses of judicial power. Many prominent Idaho political leaders, including former Idaho Senator Jim McClure, have suggested some type of Congressional oversight of judges.

Article I, Section 8 of the U.S. Constitution allows such oversight and Congress periodically conducts hearings on the judiciary already. I advocate making greater, wiser use of this authority to help rein-in out-of-control, activist federal judges.

Congress can and does provide oversight to help make sure the federal government runs better – for the benefit of every American. It can also help expose bureaucrats – and judges – who have exceeded the bounds of their legitimate authority.


Frustrated citizens now advocate mandatory retirement ages or fixed terms for judges. Others call for the impeachment of activist federal judges. Article III, Section 1 of the Constitution specifies that federal judges "shall hold their offices during good behavior."

To help identify instances where judges have failed to adhere to this Constitutional standard, I believe there should be some continued Congressional oversight after judges are appointed. Former Idaho Senator Jim McClure has suggested once every ten years as a reasonable "check-in" with individual judges.

Without periodic oversight, the Judicial branch runs the entire show, with no accountability. The Legislative and Executive branches are elected by the people; federal judges are not. To maintain a representative democracy, as the founders intended, Congress must continue to be the check on the courts that was written into the Constitution more than two centuries ago.

I believe oversight of government bureaucrats and the federal judiciary is not only authorized by the Constitution, it is an essential component of our representative democracy.



The Message of the Dalai Lama - Truth or Deception?

He's a man proclaiming peace, compassion and happiness, but is he really? His message of non-violence and the universal brotherhood and sisterhood of people everywhere has been delivered to countless heads of state all the way down to small children.

But he's also a man who believes objective truth doesn't exist, the human soul is ultimately good and that we shouldn't convert people from one religion to another as this is too difficult for a person to do.

The Dalai Lama, both the head of state and spiritual leader of the Tibetan people, will bring his message to Idaho when he visits Sun Valley September 11 and 12. As a Tibetan Buddhist, the Dalai Lama's visit should prompt a response from Christians, in light of both the Bible and reality.

The worldview the Dalai Lama believes in states that no objective truth exists and, thus, whatever religion or pathway to truth works for us is what we should pursue.

Christians need to keep in mind, however, that this belief does not make any sense and it is neither hateful nor intolerant to point this out. In fact, pointing out an irrational belief on matters of such importance is the most loving thing we can do for a person.

The Dalai Lama's belief that we should all follow whatever belief works the best for us, implies that none of these beliefs are really true, just a helpful placebo. But the great religions of the world do not merely claim to be a placebo and if the Dalai Lama is correct, then the religions are wrong and should not be followed. There is no way that Jesus can be God incarnate and the only way to the Father – the message of Christianity – if the Dalai Lama is correct. The Dalai Lama isn't neutral; he, too, has a viewpoint he wants to persuade Christians to adopt. That is why it seems that, to the Dalai Lama, objective truth really does exist (his own view of it)!

Furthermore, if no objective truth exists, what do we make of the virtues the Dalai Lama advocates? It would

seem that if religious truth is simply discovered by each individual as he sees fit, what do we make of Satanism, rapists, Hitler or China? Aren't these people simply following what they find is best for them even if, in the case of China, it means oppression for Tibet? It seems the Dalai Lama is borrowing from another worldview – a more consistent one – in order to make claims to support his own.

Thus, contrary to both the Dalai Lama and the philosophy you'll hear preached in the popular culture, we need a religion that advocates objective truth and the existence of a transcendent God over man in order to make any sense of either ethics or politics. Anything less than that is simply confused and harmful to the spiritual

development of an individual and society.

Also, it should be obvious that this view is not only unreasonable

but also unbiblical. In John 14:6, Jesus claims to be "the way and the truth and the life," and thus, all roads do not lead to God. Jesus alone is the way. Likewise, Romans 1:19-20 not only supports the existence of truth but also states we can be aware of it as well.


That is why everyone who hears the Dalai Lama's message must come to the conclusion that Christianity and Buddhism can't both be correct. We also can't come to the conclusion that "whatever is true for you is what you should follow" as that view is rationally unacceptable.

Rather, the proper response for Christians is obviously to love and be concerned for the Dalai Lama's soul. We must love him and his followers enough to point them toward the true source of peace, compassion and happiness.

Who is *The Heavenly Man*? He is a humble Chinese peasant turned pastor who has been arrested and tortured several times for merely preaching the Gospel of Christ in his native land, the first time, when he was 17. He

has also seen God move in many miraculous ways. Reading the story of Brother Yun, as he is called, is like finding lost chapters from the book of Acts.

One of his imprisonments was three months in a cell so small he could neither stand up nor stretch out. But he said God graciously provided him a Bible by way of a sympathetic guard, so that he was able to endure. He acquired his first Bible through divine intervention. He'd begun praying night and day for the Scriptures when, at 16, he'd seen God heal his pagan father of cancer. No one had a Bible and Yun had no idea how to acquire one, other than to pray. Finally, one night, two men brought one to the door of his family's mud house saying that God had directed them there. They were secretive, but had been obedient to a vision.

Brother Yun acquired the nickname Heavenly Man because of one incident that took place in 1984 outside a house where a small body of believers was meeting. As he approached, the police stopped him for interrogation. When they demanded his name and address, all he would say, in a loud voice, was that he was a Heavenly Man, whose home was in Heaven.

Thus, the believers inside, who could hear it, were able to flee to safety. As for baptism, they often did it at night in ice-covered rivers to avoid detection. I hope the next book you buy and read will be *The Heavenly Man*. Then maybe you can get your whole church to read it, as mine has been challenged to do.



Generally, a doula will visit with the pregnant couple before the baby is born to discuss the mother's health history, childbirth education, and methods of relaxation and pain relief. It is also a good time to connect with other support people who plan to attend the birth and reassure them that they can be helpful during the labor process. A doula will help establish a birth plan according to how the expecting mom would like to experience her birth as well as postpartum care and feeding options for the baby.

When labor begins the doula will meet with the

laboring mom wherever she chooses to have her baby whether it is in a hospital, birthing center, or even at home! During labor, the doula's role is to help comfort, and emotionally support the laboring mom and dad. There are many methods of breathing techniques, massage, water birthing, and position changes that are beneficial during labor. A doula can suggest or help with comfort measures.

After the baby is born, a postpartum visit will be scheduled. Postpartum visits are very important because there is a decreased risk of postpartum depression, improved breastfeeding, greater maternal satisfaction, and better mother-infant bonding. During the visit you can reflect upon your birth and your doula can offer help and resources for the family. Many doulas will even prepare a birth story for you.

There is a Christian Doula Network in the Treasure Valley with trained professionals representing organizations such as DONA (Doulas of North America www.dona.org), CAPP (Childbirth and Postpartum Professional Association www.cappa.net) and ALACE (Association of Labor Assistants and Childbirth Educators www.alace.org).

U.S. Conservatives Consider What Roberts' Confirmation Could Mean

(AgapePress) - As conservatives anticipate the process that many hope will lead to Appellate Judge John G. Roberts' confirmation as Justice Sandra Day O'Connor's replacement on the U.S. Supreme Court, many are wondering what they can expect Bush's nominee to bring to the bench if confirmed. Some pro-family leaders are convinced Roberts needs to be forthcoming about his conservative philosophy, since indications are that most Americans favor traditional values.

Last month, a national survey commissioned by American Values and the American Family Association found that U.S. voters prefer a "more conservative" U.S. Supreme Court over a "more liberal" high court by 50.3% to 30.5%. The majority of survey respondents also indicated they disapprove of a number of the federal courts' most liberal decisions, suggesting that they want to see the federal judiciary move in a more conservative direction in the future.

For instance, majorities of those surveyed said they did not approve of several major judicial rulings at various levels on key cultural issues, including the decisions on the constitutionality of burning the American flag (55.5% disapprove); local use of eminent domain for private development (88.8% disapprove); the establishment of the right for same-sex couples to marry (60.1% disapprove); and the ruling "under God" in the Pledge of Allegiance unconstitutional (80.9% disapprove).

Most respondents also looked unfavorably on protecting access to partial-birth abortion (64.9% disapprove); and prohibiting public displays of the Ten Commandments under many circumstances (68.9% disapprove).

American Family Association chairman Don Wildmon observes that while some U.S. senators are applying liberal litmus tests to Bush's judicial nominees, the American

voters themselves apparently oppose key pillars of the court's liberal agenda. "By all accounts," Wildmon says, "John Roberts is a conservative, and he should consider that conservatism an asset, not a liability as he proceeds through the confirmation process."

American Values president Gary Bauer agrees.

He says the July survey clearly "demonstrates that President Bush's judicial nominees need not fear appearing before the U.S. Senate and stating their opposition to the liberal judicial agenda." So Roberts' best during the upcoming Senate judicial confirmation hearings.

However, one Princeton University scholar is warning conservatives not to expect the new Supreme Court nominee to give them victory after victory if he is confirmed to the high court. Professor Robert George points out that, as a strict constructionist, Judge John Roberts will be very careful in his deliberations.

"There is no guarantee with an originalist or a constitutionalist judge that that judge will always rule in favor of the conservative side in a political debate," George asserts. "Nor should

there be any guarantee." The task of the court justice, he says, is not to give victories but rather to interpret the strict meaning of the constitution.

For this reason, some pro-life conservatives are cautiously reserving judgment and avoiding any endorsement of Roberts until he has revealed his true stance on abortion and other sanctity-of-life issues. However, one Christian pro-life activist believes the appellate judge's reputation as a strict constructionist is in and of itself good news for the sanctity-of-life movement.

This past weekend David Bereit, national director of STOPP International, led a group of pro-life young people in several protests in defense of Roberts. The group demonstrated at the Supreme Court building, outside

Democrat Senate offices, and at abortion facilities throughout the District of Columbia.

Bereit believes many who oppose Judge John Roberts' confirmation are liberal detractors and pro-abortion attackers who are simply full of fear. "They're terrified of the Constitution in its original form," the activist says. "The Constitution of the United States gives no one the right to terminate the life of an innocent person through abortion or any other means."

Any effort to stall the process, Bereit insists, or "to prevent somebody who could potentially be a strict constructionist who would interpret the Constitution as written rather than somebody who can legislate from the bench and be a judicial activist" is nothing more than "an attempt to obstruct justice."

Another outspoken Christian leader, Dr. James Dobson, feels the debate over Judge Roberts nomination is a perfect opportunity for the public to examine how U.S. judges have turned the Constitution topsy turvy.

He maintains it is the American people, through their duly elected officials, who are supposed to make laws to guide the nation. However, the Focus on the Family chairman says in America today, "The people are not given a chance because an un-elected, unaccountable court - appointed for life - is making the decisions for them."

"We think that's wrong," Dobson says. "We think that the people ought to be allowed to choose - and we do believe in the legislative process." For that reason, the pro-family leader says he welcomes the debate that will accompany John Roberts' confirmation hearings.
